The Jam Tent is a vast umbrella that can help you enjoy the festival even more! Every activity is tied to supporting scholarships for up-and-coming accordion students who will be seen on the festival stage as they grow up and advance in their skills. In the meantime, the Jam Tent can keep you in-

formed about what we are planning and how students will be featured in and around the Jam Tent.

For more than a decade, the Jam Tent has served as an anchor to all accordionists in search of connecting with others. Each year students compete for cash prizes and this is a great way to support the next generation of students The tent is open on two sides, chairs for guests surround the players. The Festival's well-planned program included guest artists Michael Bridge, Stas Venglevski, Mirco Patarini, Nikolay Bine and Murl Allen Sanders. Also performing



were The University of Missouri Kansas-City Community Accordion Ensemble and the ATG Festival Accordion Orchestra. The Club is currently photographing and cataloging the collection and looks forward to updating you in the future.




Membership Update




