Accordions Usher in SF Giants at Italian Heritage Night

A trio of some of San Francisco Bay Area's premier performing accordion musicians (**Steve Albini, Ron Borelli** and **Ron Sfarzo**) was the featured pre-game entertainment at the San Francisco Giants game at Oracle Park during Italian Heritage Night on July 25, 2023.

The accordionists initially performed for 30 minutes at the Willie Mays gate entrance with familiar Italian tunes: *Quando, Quando, Quando; Al Di La; La Campagnola; Chitarra Romana; Guaglione,* and *Tarantella*. On the field, the Balliamo! Italian folk dance group of Sacramento danced with their ribboned tambourines and folk costumes to the mandolin sounds of *Funiculi Funicula*. Then the trio was projected on Oracle Park's giant 4K video screen, so that 40,000+ fans could see and hear the accordionists performing *Marina* on their assorted Roland accordions, with Steve Albini's spirited voice resonating throughout the arena. Soprano Maria Fassio Pignati beau-



tifully sang *The Star-Spangled Banner*. Fast-forward to the end of the game and hooray ... the Giants bested the Oakland A's by a score of 2 to 1! It was a fantastic opportunity for Steve Albini, Ron Borelli and Ron Sfarzo to showcase their talent and be accordion ambassadors with San Francisco's official instrument!



ATG turns Hyatt Regency Lisle into center of accordion world!



This past July, in a sleepy suburb near Chicago, accordion players from around the globe descended upon the Hyatt Regency Lisle hotel, their presence transforming it, even if for just a few days, into the center of the accordion world.

As a member of the Accordionists and Teachers Guild, July is always circled in **RED** on my calendar. That's when I join my international accordion friends for seminars, workshops, student competitions and virtuoso performances.

Concerts were held over a 3-day period at nearby Wheaton College. This year, the festival orchestra (pictured below) was 45 members strong and featured ATG members from all over the US, Canada, Germany, Italy, Austria, Switzerland, Australia, New Zealand and China. They performed accordion arrangements of **ABBA** tunes, **Star Trek** themes, **Star Wars** themes and a medley from **Phantom of the Opera**! We also heard several new works for accordion, the UMKC accordion ensemble, and headliner performances by Cory Pesaturo, Grayson Masefield and Stas Venglevski. As an added bonus, there was a traveling group from the French Island of Reunion, near Madagascar. *Orchestra Polyphonia* featured 65 musicians, almost all of them high school girls, speaking French and sporting accordions! 




Membership Report, Robert Cooperstein

Annual Bryant Park Summer Accordion Festival in NYC

This year's "Accordions Around the World in Bryant Park" (AAW) features women-led projects with Diana Burco's Colombian Vallenato, Finland's Suistamon Sähkö, and an all-female Ragini Ensemble in partnership with Brooklyn Raga Massive. New York City's Evolution of the Accordion Festival at Bryant Park

Since 2011 the free outdoor Bryant Park Accordion Festival has been one of several summer outdoor Bryant Park Picnic performances supported by the Bank of America. The festival has undergone varying name changes and formats. Aria-

na Hellerman became the founder and curated of "Accordions Around the World in Bryant Park" in 2013 and created a new title, schedule and format for the accordion performances. There were 20 accordionists and an assortment of instruments from the family of accordions. Harmoniums, button-boxes, bandoneons and more convened to showcase throughout the park the multitude of genres





that the accordion is linked with. AAW emphasis is on folk and genres like bachata, Balkan, Cajun, classical, cumbia, forró, jazz, klezmer, Middle Eastern, musette, pop, qawwali, rock, tango, tarantella, vallenato, zydeco, and more. The extended evenings included an "Accordion Jam and Dance Parties" theme that featured Eastern European wedding music (June), a Northern Brazilian hoe down (July) and the American Accordion Association celebrating its 75th anniversary (August) with more accordionists and bands in the park until 10 PM.

Bryant Park

By 2014, accordionists participated weekly from 5:00-7:15 PM in AAW throughout the park. During 2015 the accordionists were performing weekly from July to August, 6:00-8:00 PM throughout the park. There was a double performance during the last week of August with a special event, "Accordion Bands Festival" from 4:30-10:00 PM!



There was a 2-year hiatus of Picnic in the Park due to Covid-19. In 2022 the Accordion Festival returned to Bryant Park Picnic Performances and was video streamed on YouTube. The nearly 3-hr performance highlighting music of Afghanistan, Ukraine, and Mexico can be viewed at: https://www.youtube.com/live/hyXsl-ChReQ. This year the AAW was also compressed to three hours in one evening, August 25, 2023 from 7-10 PM.
