

Sambre-et-Meuse (1879). Bernard did a splendid job—aided by his *Képi Militaire* (French military hat)!






#### ABOUT OUR PLAYERS FOR AUGUST

I've sorry that I am unable to join the lamity and intervise of Lou Sopen, and to way good by to him.


I thought you might like to know I mut Lou in Fargo, New in 1975 and that was the leginning of a long and unending trieniship of many good times.
