November Meeting—WOW!!!

Pres. Peter Di Bono welcomed the crowd and announced that we'll be needing help at the welcome table. He also introduced Barbara Petromilli, niece of Anthony Galla-Rini, and Lou Di Maggio and his wife Jane (Lou replaced Dick Contino on the Horace Heidt show!). I tried to catch up with Barbara Petromilli after the meeting, in order to meet her and take a photo, but she got away. I did have the great pleasure of meeting Lou and Jane after the meeting. Lou said he'd be willing to play a bit while still there, but I never had the opportunity to get an accordion into his hands before he was gone. Lou, I hope you'll come and play for us "for real"!

I am told that a tape was played over the loudspeakers of **Vince Cirelli**, recorded by **Don Pandori** at the hospital where Vince was a patient. In the tape Vince thanked everyone for their good wishes and promised to be back soon. Yes, Vince! HURRY BACK!!


The first artist of the day was Doris Sprugasci who

came all the way from Greenfield-about 140 miles! Doris was surrounded by her loval entourage of family and friends, played an electronic Petosa accordion and also has a beautiful, sweet voice. She played the lively polka O Marie; For Your Hugs and Kisses; Mala Femmena;;Let Me Call You Sweetheart (Walter and Teri Traverso danced): Tic-Toc Polka: Whispering; and Das Lied der Heimat (song of the

Homeland). I'm so sorry to have missed hearing Doris play. I have heard nothing but good things about her performance.



Marian Kelly certainly needs no introduction! She's one of the finest players in the Bay Area. Again I was sorry to miss almost all of Marian's performance. She played Over the Rainbow (arr. Marocco); Andalucia (arr. Magnante); the theme from Out of Africa: Bel Viso (Frosini); Song for Nancy (Marocco); Fascination (Galla-Rini, whose niece Barbara Petromilli was in the audience);

Green Light (Magnante). Marian played her beautiful Excelsior accordion which was overhauled by Vince Cirelli about five years ago—and she played almost entirely without music.

At the point when I arrived, Marian was playing her encore piece, requested by **Isabelle Massolo**: the "Chicken Polka," imitating a chicken by using the clarinet reeds. It absolutely cracked me up!

Just knowing Marian and her playing, I can say with confidence that her entire performance was first-rate.



The Internationals

After intermission (and another gorgeous spread of

great food!) and the drawings, we were treated to a very professional and polished performance by The Internationals, featuring Bob Maggiora on Dallapé accordion: Steve McGinnis on bass guitar; Porter Golz on percussion; and Jan Meere on horns. All four of them do vocals and yodeling, and they are terrific! Their ad says "Dance music from everywhere," and that surely is true! Although they dress in Oktoberfest garb, their music covers the world. They opened with a great "Oom-pah" polka with a yodel. I did not get the name of the piece, but it was typically joyous Oktoberfest music. I love any opportunity to use the little German I know, so it's fun for me to write the names of some of the pieces played by The Internationals: Wir Kommen von den Bergen (We're coming from the mountains); Pros't Kamarad (sort of like, "Here's to you, Buddy"): Alpenecho Jodel (Echo from the mountains yodel). They then proceeded to Tex-Mex (or is it Norteño?) with A Little Bit Is Better than Nada (Sometimes You Want the Whole Enchilada), which had everyone laughing. On to Italy with Flight of the Angels, then a cowboy yodel (Steve was the yodeler), fast and loud; then to Russia with a medley in which I recognized Dark Eyes and bits of Song of the Volga Boatmen. Suddenly, magically, out of nowhere, a Schnapps appeared in the hand of each of the musicians! After the inevitable toast, we heard The Fireman's Song and What A Wonderful World, sung by Jan the horn player in the style of Louis Armstrong, and what a great imitation it was! After a rousing When the Saints Go Marching In, we got Dean Martin's That's

Amore then C'è La Luna Mezzo Mare and Just A Gigolo.

Time for audience participation: Singin' Hi-Yi Yippy Yippy Yay (??) where everyone sang the refrain every time it came up. Each verse represented a different country: She'll Be Comin' Around the Mountain; then a Hawaiian version with war drums; a Portuguese spoof; Chinese; Australian Aborigine (Tie Me Kangaroo Down); New York (Hava Nagila); hometown (lovely waltz with vocal trio). Their Finale, which I recall they performed at one of our meetings way back when we were at Donworth Hall: I Don't Want to Go Home (The Party's Just Begun).

WOW!!! Ein Prosit der schönen Musik! What a show!!!






