### A Memory of Leon Sash

On Ebay, the online auction site, an accordion up for auction caught my attention recently and brought back a very nice memory. The accordion especially built for Leon Sash, the great chromatic jazz accordionist out of Chicago, was a Giulietti that had a very distinctive look to it in that it had a piano-looking keyboard with 4 rows


of "piano" keys on the treble side instead of the usual buttons associated with the chromatic instruments of today. I'm not sure if the black "piano" keys had a function or were just there



to complete the impression of a piano keyboard. As I understand it, this type of chromatic accordion was also used by Frosini in the early days, since the likes of chromatic accordions with buttons was not accepted, and so a likeness to the piano accordion keyboard was necessary in order to get work in those days.

Leon Sash was a very creative blind accordionist who rose to prominence in 1957 with his performance at the Newport Jazz Festival, where for the first time an accordion was used.

In my early 20's I came across his wonderful album, Sash'n' Jazz, a compilation of standards and original compositions that Leon performed with his quartet.

What caught my ear was the full rich chords that I had not heard coming from any piano accordion. The reason he could get this deep rich sound was that his hand could reach more notes to form his chords than possible on a piano keyboard, and his use of open chords which gave a wonderful distinctive harmony to the pieces he played.

Upon hearing his record, I wrote to Leon telling him how much I loved the sound of his music, and indicating that I wanted to switch over to the chromatic accordion so that I, too, could in some way produce that exquisite harmony. To my surprise, I received a very nice reply from him thanking me for my letter and compliment, and encouraging me to continue on with my piano accordion studies. "The piano accordion is a fine instrument," he wrote. "You have a number of years invested, and I suggest that you keep at it and strive

to be the best you can be." I wish I still had that note as those words were special to me coming from such a great artist and gentleman.

And so over the years, in trying to emulate the grand sound of Leon's chords, I came up



with my own version that I like to use in place of the 6th chords that are heard commonly today. As an example, a chord with the notes of G-A-C-E, could be replaced by an open chord of, C-G-B-E. Try it, and see what you think!


## Directions (MAP ON PAGE 2)

FROM THE NORTH: Take Highway 280 South, exit Westborough Blvd. Stay in left lane and turn left at the stop light (Westborough Blvd.). Proceed approx. I mile to Camaritas Ave., which is the second signal, and turn left (the Camaritas sign is difficult to see; if it's Orange Ave. to your right, then that's Camaritas on the left). In next block, turn right on Arroyo Drive. Municipal Services Building is on the right side of the street.

FROM THE SOUTH: Take Highway 280 North, exit Avalon Dr./Westborough Blvd. and continue parallel to freeway to stop light at Westborough Blvd. Turn right onto Westborough Blvd. and proceed as above.

FROM HIGHWAY 101 take 380 from San Bruno, west to 280 and proceed north; continue as shown above.

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### 2005 Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival to Feature Accordion

We hear from a press release submitted by SFAC Member **Henry Doktorski** that Henry has been invited to join the music faculty as Instructor of Accordion at the Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival at the University of Alaska campus for two weeks during July 2005 (see ad below). He will teach accordion classes, and expose his students to a broad range of repertoire, including classical, ethnic and popular styles, which they may perform during recitals and concerts both as soloists and as an accordion orchestra.

Henry will also be a featured performer at faculty concerts and plans to present an eclectic mix of music including works from the Baroque and Classical ages, the Age of Vaudeville, classics by Piazzolla and various styles of ethnic and folk music.

Said Jo Ryman Scott, who was responsible for lining up students for accordion classes, and who found Henry: "Next summer we'll be offering classical and folk accordion taught by Henry Doktorski from Oakdale, PA. Henry is also an accomplished organist and classical pianist. He will be teaching beginning as well as intermediate-to-advanced piano accordion, and he will also teach beginning button box accordion. I have fond memories of folk accordion music as a child in the Midwest.... I think Henry's talents will be a wonderful addition to our Festival next summer."

The Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival begins on Sunday, July 17 and ends on Sunday, July 31, 2005, and will be an excellent boost for the accordion.



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### ACE Ensemble News By Lynn Ewing

The ACE Ensemble has had the very rewarding experience of performing at two elementary schools recently, one at St. Andrews in Redwood City in December and one at St. Joseph's in Atherton in January. During these performances, we try to engage the children in the music and with the accordion. At St. Andrews, the children loved identifying the familiar carols in our "Christmas Potpourris," and at St. Joseph's they enjoyed making tick-tock noises to "Syncopated Clock." At both schools, we explained how music can tell a story, and introduced the character with their particular themes as we played and pretended to be "In a Persian Market."

They were excited to hear songs they recognized from the movie "Snow White" and the theme from "The Muppet Show." We told them to put on their listening ears when they are watching movies and television, because there is a lot of music to that helps tell the story and create mood. For a bit of multi-cultural exposure, they enjoyed clapping to "Mexican Hat Dance," and marched out in time to "The Spanish March." We told them what themes to listen for in "American Folk Rhapsody" ("Billy Boy," "Skip to My Lou," and "Shenandoah"), and we told them that Joe loves "Billy Boy" because of the girl who can bake a cherry pie!

We explained how you can tell whether a song is over or whether it is continuing by watching the conductor's arms (many symphony audiences are still confused about this). We asked them to listen to the dynamics in the music, and to notice that not everyone is playing the same thing at the same time—we play different parts just as though we were violins, oboes and trumpets.

It is always an exciting part of the performance for the children to see how the accordion itself works. They guess why it is called "piano" accordion, and we explain that its sound is created somewhat like a clarinet, from wind blowing through reeds. We show how the various reed switches can make a single note sound 8 different ways, and show the inside of the keyboard by popping off the grille cover, which always stimulates gasps of awe.

The ACE Ensemble is committed to bringing live music to the children of our community, and to promoting our wonderful instrument, so if you have grandchildren or children in elementary schools, or have contacts with elementary schools, please let them know that we are available to provide a free concert at an assembly during school hours. 
