Directions to Oyster Point Yacht Club, 911 Marina Blvd., South San Francisco



Steve Balich stepped
up to the plate and
did a fantastic job of
entertaining us while
we waited for the arrival of our first act,
Alex Yasko. Thanks so
much, Steve!

Alex Yasko, whom we have known in the past as Alex Yaskin, arrived and got set up in record time. He described

some of his musical styles, which cover the gamut. First he played a Swedish style piece, followed by a Blues style, *Break It To Me Gently*.

Continuing his wide variety of musical styles. Alex played what he called a "super heavy rock" number, and then a Reggae ar-

rangement called White Side of Pale. Next came what Alex called a "punk rock" arrangement followed by an original composition by Alex, a rumba called When I'm Alone.

Alex does indeed put on a very interesting and offbeat show. Thanks, Alex!

Next we were treated to a jazzy performance by The Di Bono Trio, featuring our Pres. Peter Di Bono on accordion, John Stafford—originally from New Orleans—on clarinet and sax (John also did some vocals and filled in with maracas, both single and dou-

Among our guests at this meeting were Jerry and Susan Venturi from Venturi House of Music in Madera, CA



MIDI and how to make it sound like an authentic full band. Besides that, you couldn't know a nicer guy.

Chuck said he'd like to play the 1812 Overture—but will pass this time! Instead, he started out with the lovely But Not For Me, followed by Glen Miller's String of Pearls, Perdido (with sections working against each other—very difficult), Do You Know What It Means to Miss New Orleans highlighting the sounds of banjo, clarinet, tuba and drums. Chuck played a great polka of which I did not get the name and did not immediately recognize; then the beautiful tango Jealousy. Chuck demonstrated some very effective key changes while playing "Some-a-da-Where-a-my Love," using mandolin for the verse, then the orchestra for the chorus—and moving up by half-steps at various places.

We would have happily gone on listening but






"Afterglow" jamming with Peter di Bono, Chuck Berger, Dennis Stoscher, Bob Rizzetto
