President's Message


I hope you came to the last meeting; it was one of the best ever. Over 125 accordion lovers packed the clubhouse, and they were not disappointed. The new

Idaho and There's No You are wonderful tunes not heard often, but Lou's renditions will surely bring them to the fore.

San Francisco jazzman, **Dave Baioni**, came on next and treated us to some special arrangements. Joining Dave was clarinetist, **Vince Aguiar**, who also did a great job on flute. **Marc Hinchman** on drums filled out the trio. Dave's hobby is the study of martial arts, and he is a holder of the coveted black belt.

**Dominic Palmisano** took over the break-time refreshments, did a little "loaves and fishes miracle," and everyone was treated to a midday snack. Great job, Dominic.

We divided the raffle proceeds, and awarded three winners. Needless to say, **George Alves** was one of them. Another was our special guest performer, **Carl Fortina**, who graciously donated his winnings back to the Club's Scholarship Fund. We also gave away some CDs, and plan more of that in the future.

Marian Kelly, playing her magnificent Excelsior accordion, started the second half of the program with a sizzling rendition of Pietro Frosini's *Floret*. Marian then demonstrated the orchestral possibilities of the mighty Excelsior with *Swanee River*, *Desafinado*, and Galla Rini's arrangement of *Fascination*; Marian is always a favorite. By the way, Vince Cirelli completely overhauled her accordion about two years ago, and Marian says the accordion is better now than when it was new.

**Dr. Harry** ("Painless Harry") **Gay** then joined with our special guest, **Carl Fortina**, and soon had everyone delighted with their renditions of some accordion favorites. They took turns, one playing melody and the other harmony and fills, and just kept throwing it back and forth that way. It's amazing that those wonderfully musical arrangements just happen, improvised on the spot; "That Doggie In The Window" tickled everyone.

Carl Fortina then played solo, and mesmerized the audience with *Tico Tico*, *Here's That Rainy Day*, and a dizzyingly, agile performance of John Pezzolo's *Flying Butterflies*. Carl finished up his performance with the title song from the blockbuster movie, *The Godfather* in which he is the accordionist in the original soundtrack. Everyone wanted more, but Carl wanted it to end there, on that very high note.

It wasn't over, however. Unbeknownst to Carl, and while Marian Kelly was performing, Dominic Palmisano secretly ushered into the back of the clubhouse, our very special guest visitor disguised in sunglasses and a baseball cap with his collar pulled up. After getting everyone's attention, and introducing Byrne Newhart and Bob Markeson, two great Bay Area musicians, I noted that Carl Fortina is such an important person in the musical world, having performed in over 600 movies, and countless television, radio, and commercial spots, that one of the greatest jazz accordionists in the world--and in fact, some say he invented jazz accordion--was present in the audience. At that point Carl Fortina, had an inquisitive look about him which turned to disbelief, when the great Art Van Damme came forward from the back of the clubhouse to thank Carl for his many years of dedication to the accordion. The two shared a warm embrace and some quick stories on the stage. Both of these greats

remained to talk with our members, and take pictures.

About 45 of us, including special guests **Carl Fortina**, **Art Van Damme and wife Lory**, then went to The Basque Cultural Center for dinner, and more fun. The evening concluded with a surprise birthday cake for my wife **Victoria**, presented by our son, Peter, while **Ron Borelli** and I played Happy Birthday. What a day!

It's difficult to assess in advance when these great events are going to occur because they are so spontaneous. I urge you to come to out Sunday meetings regularly, and who knows who might turn up one of these days. You won't want to miss out again.

... On Tuesday, September 7, 2004. We'll continue with the Sunday meetings at least three more times and then decide whether to make it permanent.


