#### September Meeting: A Little of Everything

This was our required annual meeting, including elections and voting on changes to the by-laws. By acclamation of those present, the following officers and directors were elected: President: Peter Di Bono (incumbent); Vice President: Joe Smiell; Secretary: Rosemary Armanino (incumbent); Treasurer: Dominic Palmisano (incumbent); Board members: Vince Cirelli (incumbent), Jim Firpo (incumbent), Bob Hansen and Valerie Kieser. (Since this time, Dominic Palmisano decided not to continue as Treasurer, and Bob Hansen agreed to sign on for this post.)

By-Laws: Those present at the meeting voted unanimously for the board-recommended change of making the fiscal year January 1-December 31, while maintaining the membership year at October 1-September 30. The other proposed change to the By-Laws, regarding committees, although scheduled, was not voted upon at this meeting.

Our MC, Lynn Ewing, announced that Frank Marocco himself will be entertaining at the October 2 Silicon Valley Accordion Society meeting; and also that AbsolutAccord will be giving a concert on Sunday afternoon, October 9 at the Unitarian Universalists of San Mateo, 300 E. Santa Inez Ave. in San Mateo. Lynn also called on visitors to make themselves known, and we had several from the Accordion Club of the Redwoods, including Marjorie Konrad and her young, talented grandson Keith Church, and also Tom Shamp of the Accordion Club of the Redwoods. It was a special pleasure for me to meet Paula Re from Tracy, with whom I have been in

Then came the long-awaited musical portion of the afternoon, beginning with Dennis Stoscher -who is always entertainingwith his "accordiaoki" (pick your spelling!) act, playing fills along with a recording of a singer singing in Italian. Thanks to all our performers today, also to the Benedettos for another splendid food offering, and to Lynn for being our MC.






### Great News for the SFAC!!!




