

Joseph Natoli makes his home in Northeast Ohio with his wife, JoAnn, and has been a performer and advocate of the accordion since the age of seven.

Joe started his studies with prominent Ohio accordion teacher, the late Mickey Bisilia and won the 1972 AAA US Virtuoso Accordion Championship under Mr. Bisilia's tutelage, while placing first runner-up several months later in the annual Coupe Mondiale World Accordion Championships in Caracas, Venezuela. In 2008, Joe won the grand prize





for the first Roland US V-Accordion competition held in Los Angeles, California.

Joe's education includes Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the University of Toronto Faculty Of Music, where he was the first student accepted there to use the free bass accordion as an applied major instrument. Mr. Natoli started his musical career mostly as a performer, but had always been interested in composition, and has focused on his compositional craft even more in recent years. Joe has written many original pieces in all musical styles and genres for standard and free bass accordion.

Some of Joe's most recent recordings include an all-acoustic accordion CD called *Omaggio*, and an alldigital Roland V-Accordion CD entitled *Waltz for Ron*. In 2018, a new CD was released entitled *Chameleon (Vol 1)* which focuses on the widely diverse styles of Joe's original compositional output. Soon to follow were *Chameleon (Vol 2)* in 2019 and *Chameleon (Vol 3)* in 2020.

later adapted and made famous as *Love Me Tender* by Elvis Presley.









Club Member Seeks Info: History of Accordion & Italian Community of Northern California

Greetings SFAC Family!

Hope you are doing well. I cannot believe it has been only a year and a half since I first joined the club. I have been enjoying our Zoom time, and I hope to see you all one day for the music circle soon! For now, I am writing to request your help with my research. Some of you may know that I am a Ph.D. student in musicology at UC Santa Cruz, and that my research focuses on the accordion in Northern California. At this time, I am interested in the Italian community from the 1900s - until 1960s and how t

At this time, I am interested in the Italian community from the 1900s - until 1960s and how they helped to foster the unique presence of piano accordion in the Bay Area and the greater West Coast. I am using memory, nostalgia, and cultural sustainability as my theoretical frameworks - but at the end of the day, it is truly about me finding the sources to support these theories. This is where I am running into trouble.

At this time with archives closed, I am having a difficult time finding primary source documents. Do you have any of the following that might help me piece together some history? I am in need of: old recital programs, board documents, addresses and advertisements for accordion studios, fliers, transcripts of interviews, recordings of studio recitals, newspaper announcements. They can be from clubs, parties, festivals, or your private collection. Please contact me if you have some information that you think may help me, and if you are willing to share a picture with me via email. All information I collect is documented, and only used if approved by the provider. Please note all items I collect

(interviews or otherwise) are for my research purposes only and will not be published unless I am granted permission by the owner.

ENGLISH TRANSLATION OF GERMAN SITE, AKKORDEON.ONLINE

Dear Accordion Friends,

Andrea Iven, Editor of akkordeon.online, and my accordion friend Peter Michael Haas, invited me to evaluate the English version of the new website **akkordeon.online**, based on the German accordion print magazine *Akkordeon*. It turns out that the English translations are quite good.

Beyond that, the site is a fine lens for accordion information and news in Europe and the world, so I wanted to share it. (Full disclosure: I have no financial interest in this, just site access for translation evaluation purposes.)

As to my own interests, two articles stood out. One was about **Yiddish Summer Weimar** (<u>https://akkordeon.online/en/yiddish-summer-</u> <u>weimar-findet-statt/)</u>, which includes information about 1000 previously undiscovered hand-written Klezmer music manuscripts collected by Zusman Kiselgof. These are being digitized by an international group of volunteers. More info about that project is available at this website: <u>https://klezmerinstitute.org/kmdmp/</u>. The digitized versions already done are licensed for sharing and use.

The second article was about Andreas Nebl's accordion recordings of some of the many harpsichord sonatas of Scarlatti, which I had just been discussing with a friend who, like me, did not know accordion versions existed! (<u>https://akkordeon.online/andreas-nebl-domenico-scarlatti-20-sonatas/</u>.)

The beautiful print magazine Akkordeon is archived on



the site. There are bimonthly editions from June 2008 on. These are in German only right now, but at some point, will be translated. German versions are available

at <u>https://akkordeon.online/akkordeon-magazin/</u>.

Find the site here: <u>akkordeon.online.</u> It should come up in English, but if not, press the EN button on top right. You don't need (or want) to use Google Translate. The English version on the site is better. You can browse about 20% of the content till the paywall or request to enroll comes up. The site has many articles from the print magazine, but also exclusive, daily updated articles by the editors.

Become a member at <u>https://steadyhq.com/en/</u> <u>akkordeononline/about</u>. You can try it free for 30 days or buy an annual (~\$40) or one month (~\$3.60) membership. The site is well worth checking out. Enjoy!


