


Annabelle just played her accordion for her talent show at school. She really enjoyed it and looks forward to playing at the club.

May Meeting Review - Alex Meixner

As a non-musician who somehow became a quintessential accidental tourist in the accordion world, I would like to describe what an Alex Meixner performance means to me. It's not about the songs he and his band play, nor about his mastery of all things musical. It's not about the kind of accordions he uses either. It's really about the kind of guy he is. Alex is always Alex - an exciting, joyous, passionate, warm and people-loving crowd pleaser.



When my wife Elaine and I first joined the SFAC we attended almost every meeting without paying the slightest attention to who would be the main

performers and what kind of music they would be playing. We just liked being in the Club. And that is how we see Alex – yes, an accordion (and trumpet) virtuoso extraordinaire, but mainly a regular guy that loves people that love music – especially accordion music!

Near the beginning of the May musical program, and before Alex had played one note, Elaine took the mic to confess she had been "stalking" him for several years (I was an accomplice), asking him to play for the SFAC, starting with his 2010 performance at the Cotati Accordion Festival; on to Teske's Germania restaurant in San Jose, 2011; Long Island, NY in 2014; several day's of Wurstfest, New Braunfels, TX, 2016; and, most recently, the Peoria, IL Oktoberfest 2018. With the opportunities finally opened up by life under COVID-19, the SFAC Board was able to secure the amazing Alex for our May 2021 SFAC musical program, granted it had to be the virtual Mr. Meixner for the time being.



Although it quickly became apparent that Alex had polkas on his mind, he got things underway with a rousing version of an accordion world favorite, *El Cumbanchero*. Ken could not help himself, taking the ZOOM screen just long enough to exclaim "that was hot!" Alex opined that, because accordion crowds tend to like a wide variety of music for the accordion, he would be playing some non-polkas despite having his Polka King accordion on. Alex (remember, he really had polkas on his mind!) then plunged into the title track of Gordon Hartman's Grammy-award-winning album, *Polkaholic*.

No Meixner performance would seem complete with his famous train medley, a rock/polka mash-up featuring train tunes by Ozzy Osborne, the Monkees, Duke Ellington, and Glen Miller. It's the seamless transitions from practiced perfection to dialed-up improv that make Alex such a great entertainer, enjoying himself at least as much as the entertained!



Despite his frenetic involvement in all things accordion, Alex remains very much the family man. Following some proud comments about his wife and 3 children, and having switched to a Munar diatonic accordion, Alex settled into a 1991 waltz his father had written for Alex's little sister Katie. After relaxing into that, he launched



into a tune which was recently released on a 45RPM record, with *Chicago Larry ry's Polka* (named after Alex's good friend and super-fan Chicago Larry Hodek) on the A-side. The B-side is yet another polka, *Radio Olympia Polka*, in honor of Olympia Radio, a pirate radio station in the Netherlands that produced this single 45RPM release. These "Cleveland-Slovenian-style instrumental button box polkas" were made for the Munar button box diatonic accordion.

Once settled into that groove, Alex, apparently feeling very at-home with the SFAC crowd (he said he did not think we would "crucify" him if he messed up), risked playing one of his own compositions, one right on the cusp of what he can get through. He played *Left in the Dust Polka*, written in the Cleveland-style associated with virtuoso Denis Novato – who is so good that he is "not allowed to compete anymore because no one could beat him."



After a spirited, convivial chat session with club members, Alex picked up his trumpet at Co-

lette's request – yes, he is a master of that instrument as well - to play *Misty*. Since we weren't prepared to let him go just yet, the encore he selected was the *Harley Polka*, which required switching back to the piano accordion, the instrument he was "most feeling" this day.

We truly hope the next time we are treated to an Alex Meixner performance it will be live right here in the San Francisco Bay Area. In the meantime, there's always <u>www.Patreon.com/AlexMeixner</u> to stay in touch virtually with Alex.

Megumi Hada's New Accordion Solos Support Student Scholarships

Talented Megumi Hada, PhD, is an accomplished accordionist and rocket scientist (cooperating with NASA) who has organized the Houston Accordion Orchestra Retreat (HAOR) directed by renowned Stas Venglevski for several years. She also promotes accordion concerts and workshops in Houston. Inspired by a workshop on composing by noted American composer and accordionist Guy Klucevsek, Meg's accordion works began in 2020. Her music is lyrical, contemporary and relaxing to the ear. Her original compositions are suited for intermediate accordionists. She has published three volumes ("Voyage," "One Thousand Messages," and "Bamboo Pathway") which each include a CD recording of Stas Venglevski performing her beautiful accordion music. You can hear full length recordings and purchase individual compositions at <u>sheetmusicplus.com</u>.

Here's what Guy Klucevsek says about Megumi's music. Megumi has released three books of her compositions in various styles, including waltzes, tangos (a form she knows intimately from her many years as a tango dancer), marches and more introspective pieces based on classical music models. On the CD recordings Stas Venglevski brings his own touch to the music, not only with his superb musicianship and respect for the material, but a command of all the styles involved and the ability to add just the right kind and amount of auxiliary notes, fills and improvisations as are appropriate to the context. Megumi Hada's compositions exude personality, warmth and humor, and reflect a new, exciting and original compositional voice. These collections are a wonderful addition to the literature for accordion which will be of great interest to intermediate and advanced players, whether student, amateur or professional.

AWAM World Accordion Day Highlights – Part 1

There is nothing better than being at a concert in person. The Harrington ARTS Center's 3-Day Accordion Festival held in **A World of Accordion Museum (AWAM)**, in Superior, WI was a perfect example of the thrill it is to be there watching and listening to wondrously melodic melodies. Here is a quick review of the performers and their wondrous gifts of transcending reality into ethereal feelings of joy and elation.

Bayan virtuoso **Stas Venglevski** is classically trained in Russia on his five-row button accordion. He composed and played a *Full Moon Suite* for **Joan Cochran Sommers**, UMKC Professor Emerita. He also performed a duet with Professor Sommers. I sat back in wonderment and could hardly believe my eyes and ears. Some things in life are ethereal and touch the soul. Such was this performance. His fingers literally touched the keys so quickly and masterfully that I watched in disbelief and pure awe.

Joan Sommers and Stas Venglevski performed a duet where the sounds of both instruments were very complementary. Professor Sommers plays her Titano accordion so professionally even though it is very large and seems overwhelmingly long to me - as if the keyboard goes on forever. Try to imagine two artists playing masterful accordion creations together; their fingers seemed to glide over the keys in an effortless way - their sounds complementing one another, creating wondrous melodies!

You would wonder how three accordionists (Joan Cochran Sommers, Betty Jo Simon and Jane Christison), dubbed the *KC Trio*, could all play in concert with one another. Well, their precision and excellence in timing and artistry were terrific!

Judy Contino, wife of legendary Dick Contino, paid tribute to her husband. She spoke of their years together as husband and wife, his dedication to their children, his artistry on the accordion and his professional life as an accordion artist and performer. Judy Contino is a supporter of the Harrington Arts Center and a true lover of the accordion.

Accordion star **Dr. Mike Middleton** followed with an accordion tribute to Dick Contino. His concert consisted of Dick Contino's favorite song selections. Imagine Dr. Middleton playing *Lady of Spain, Tico Tico, Dizzy Fingers*, the *Beer Barrel Polka, 12th Street Rag, The Battle Hymn of the Republic, The Godfather, Moon River* and the *Lichtensteiner Polka*. There were more Dick Contino favorites, but this list is just an example of how thoroughly Dr. Middleton researched


