Lou Jacklich Highlights San Francisco Accordion Club's Return to Live Music

On May 22ⁿ, **Lou Jacklich** showed the San Francisco Accordion Club what our beloved instrument is capable of, at our reunion meeting at the City of Millbrae's David J. Chetcuti Community Room. In a sense, Lou answered the call to pick up the baton after a two-year pandemic-induced hiatus. It seemed fitting that our first live, in-person featured performer was a man who has played since the Golden Age of the Accordion.

Ken Schwartz, with assistance from Pam Tom and Colette Ogata, prepared a slide show honoring this remarkable 93-year-old performer and teacher. Images dated back to his early days holding an accordion that nearly obscured the childhood musician. Accolades awarded to Mr.

Jacklich include the San Francisco Accordion Club Lifetime Achievement Award, Cotati Accordion Festival Honorary Directorship, Art Van Damme Education Award, and Certificate of Recognition and Leadership from the California State Senate. I felt honored to serve as Master-of-Ceremonies, seeking to summarize an impressive musical legacy.

Lou opened with Agustin Lara's *Grenada*, transitioning effortlessly to a Gershwin medley that included *Rhapsody in Blue, The Man I Love, S'Wonderful,* excerpts from *American in Paris*, and *Fascinating Rhythm*. We then heard *On the Trail: Grand Canyon Suite* by Ferde Grofé, in which the to-and-fro movements of a donkey came to life with staccato blasts akin to a harmonica. A traditional German folk piece followed, along with a Scandinavian "Schottische." Before leaving European traditional music, Lou rolled out the famous *Beer Barrel Polka*.

The irrepressible Collete Ogata then joined her teacher for duets of *Deep Purple*, featuring five-part harmony, a soaring version of Lecuona's *Siboney*, and Lou's own composition, *La Promesa de Amor*, dating back to one of Lou's musical trips to Mexico. Rimsky-Korsakoff's *Flight of the Bumble Bee* kept the Russian influence buzzing. They ended their set with excerpts from Lou's seminal album **Lou Jacklich Plays**, from his Capitol Record years, included Zez Confrey's compositions *Kitten on the Keys* and *Dizzy Fingers*.



Soon we were back in the Latin World with Ernesto Lecuona's *Malagueña*, followed by a trio of American jazz standards: *Misty*, *Georgia*, and a version of *I'm in the Mood for Love* that Lou arranged in honor of the style of Ernie Felice, back when Lou headed a swinging jazz quartet. *Tico-Tico* paved the way for a **Fiddler on the Roof** medley which included the title song, *Sunrise*, *Sunset*; *Matchmaker*, *Matchmaker*; and *If I Were a Rich Man*. Accenting our lighthearted mood, Lou then rendered *Sunny Side of the Street*, *Birth of the Blues*, and *Saint Louis Blues*. As an encore, Lou adapted *Tea for Two*, incorporating different key signatures and harmonic structures. Your humble correspondent took the liberty of requesting this last signature piece, highlighting Lou's creative style.



Before transitioning to a jam session, which he would conduct, Lou received a standing ova-



tion. Although the rumor mill suggests that Lou may be cutting back on major public performances, perhaps we can persuade him to continue. After eight decades of teaching hundreds of students, performing worldwide, and recording hit albums, Maestro Lou Jacklich remains in fine form. As a long-time student of Mr. Jacklich, I can attest to his dedication and commitment to his students. I would be remiss not to mention our own Steve Marshall, who transitioned from his usual accordion playing to stand-up bass,

adding musical complexity to the jam session that closed out our happy afternoon.

A world-wide broadcast of this special guest performance transpired in real time, thanks to Paul Cain, who overcame technical obstacles. The entire Board of Directors was present for this inspiring re-boot of our in-person performance tradition, including President Ken Schwartz, Vice President Rosemary Busher, Treasurer Elaine Cooperstein, Membership Director Robert Cooperstein, Member-at-Large Paul Cain, and Webmaster Randall Hicks, along with an enthusiastic audience that included a half-dozen of Lou's prior and current students. Thank you, Lou Jacklich, for your service to the accordion community, and for opening the door to a happier time. The world's oldest accordion club has risen,

Member Profile: Tseli Wu

Tseli Wu was born into a music family in China where her father taught her accordion intermittently for eight-years when she was young. She then studied music in Shanghai Normal University and intended to become a music teacher. However, once China opened its door in 1979, she had a chance to go to the States, and studied computer science instead. Before retiring, Tseli worked in the high-tech IT field for over 40 years.

While attending the Cupertino Senior Center to play ping pong, Tseli heard accordion music which sparked her curiosity. She walked to the classroom and saw Reno Di Bono teaching accordion. Reno invited Tseli to take his accordion class and introduced her to both the San Francisco Accordion Club



and Silicon Valley Accordion Society. Tseli joined Reno's class and both accordion clubs in July 2018, resumed playing the accordion and is having fun with it. She wishes to improve her playing and bring musical joy to the people around her too. Tseli thanks Reno for his teaching, friendship and getting her to pick up the accordion again after a break of over 40 years. She plays a wide variety of genres: well-known accordion favorites, waltzes, polkas, French tunes, and whatever sounds good to her!

Tseli took major steps with her accordion in May. She played solo for the SVAS and she entered the adult amateur category of the Accordion Stars International 2022 virtual competition where she received the 2nd place award and the best showing of all the US competitors who participated. Tseli said that she "was very surprised and didn't expect this honor." The Accordion Stars International is a great encouragement for her to continue keeping up with the accordion.

Tseli goes on to say, "I thank Pamela Tom for calling me and insisting that I enter the ASI competition. Otherwise I would not have known about ASI, and would not have entered without encouragement . . . thank you, Pam!"

7-year-old Annabelle became interested in taking accordion lessons after hearing her dad practice. She has been taking lessons from Mike Zampiceni for a year. She loves to sing while playing her accordion. She also loves to sing Disney songs (especially the soundtrack of *Frozen*) with her little sister. This fall Annabelle enters the second grade. Anand grew up in India and has always been musically curious and meddled with several instruments, not pursuing any of them seriously. After a random Internet search he bought an accordion.

Anand recounts his experience as an adult student competitor: "Ever since I bought my accordion, I've been obsessed with the instrument and I look forward to learning more from my teacher Mike Zampiceni. In the competition I'm playing my Petosa Artista Pro XT. The competition motivated me to learn harder songs and to push my limits. Initially I didn't have the technique to play these songs and spent several weeks to be able to play it with a very slow tempo. I'm very grateful for Mike Zampiceni, who encouraged me and kept me in check whenever I tried to play faster before I was ready. He put in a lot of emphasis towards playing it crisp and adding all the articulations marked in the music. *It's not about winning. It's all about improving.* I've already picked the songs I want to work on for Accordion Star International 2023. All the best for all contestants!"

The CASS organizer, Sheri Mignano Crawford, has designated our contribution to be awarded as a special scholarship from the San Francisco Accordion Club.

The Cotati Accordion Student Stage offers the next generation of accordionists the opportunity to perform and compete for cash prizes and scholarships to further their accordion studies. It is through your continuing support that we are able to make this grant. If attending the Festival, be sure to stop by the Student Stage and see how your support is making a difference in the lives of the student performers and the audience, and in the longevity of the accordion itself.

It's not too late for students 18-years and younger to register and compete at the Cotati Accordion Student Scholarship event. Students are encouraged to apply after consulting with their teachers. Application is free, due July 1. All materials, including application forms and copies of all sheet music are the responsibility of the applicant. The student competition is Saturday, August 20, 2022, 9:30 A.M. to 12:00 noon at Church of the Oaks, 160 W Sierra Ave, Cotati, CA. Admission is free, donations are welcome. The top-scoring student receives a \$500 scholarship; second place \$400, third place \$300. Only the top three-scoring competitors will be awarded scholarships on the stage. The Dick and Judy Contino Scholarship (\$1000) and the San Francisco Accordion Club Scholarship (\$500) are based on the highest scores; in addition, age eligibility and level of difficulty may factor in.


