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

## Augustinas Rakauskas & Greta Staponkutė with Soprano Neringa Radėnaitė

The duo "Tutto a Dio" is a young viola and accordion duo. In 2012 both Lithuanian members Greta Staponkutė and Augustinas Rakauskas started creating a common summer musical project in London where they took their first musical steps together. In the meantime, the duo started to focus on chamber music, work on a variety of arrangements as well as develop their concert career. "Tutto a Dio" is based on an exclusive combination of the viola and accordion which has been one of the most exceptional combinations in the world. The duo's repertoire has a wide range of different genres from baroque, classical and modern compositions to tango nuevo and contemporary music. The ensemble's activity in four years has accelerated significantly.

"Tutto a Dio" has excellent international achievements and is actively performing in Europe and the USA. The Duet has held recitals in California, Meine, Florida, the Consulate General of Lithuania in New York (USA), Switzerland, Latvia, Luxembourg, Italy, Bulgaria, and Greece. The Duo has received professional recognition in international competitions worldwide by winning important competitions – the "Coupe Mondiale – 2017", 1st Prize in "Premio Internazionale di Castelfirdardo 2017" (Italy), 1st Prize winners of "Trophée Mondial 2017" (France) as well as became the champions of the "Coupe Mondiale - 2018" in Lithuania. They continue their intensive concert activity in Europe and the USA.







Augustinas and Greta will be joined by soprano Neringa Radėnaitė for our SFAC meeting. Neringa Radenaite graduated from the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre, possessing two bachelors in choir-conducting and vocal performance. She later received her Master's in Opera Singing at the Conservatorio di Santa Cecilia in Rome. Neringa has performed worldwide together with duo "Tutto a Dio" touring in Europe and USA as well as the production cast opera singer in luxury cruise line "Silversea" where she won an artistic audition in 2017 to go on the music tours in Europe, Africa & Asia. She has received several international scholarships such as Ministero degli Affari Esteri scholarship for music education, Fondaziione Alimondo Ciampi scholarship as well as the scholarship of Associazione Maria Cristina di Savoia. Neringa has been awarded with the Special Maria Malibran prize in Maria Malibran International lyric singing competition in Milano, in 2018.

# Dima Oliinychenko

**Dmytro "Dima" Oliinychenko** joined the SFAC in October 2018 and blew us all away with his wonderful playing! We are so pleased that Dima will perform an opening set for the March meeting!

Dima describes himself as an amateur accordion player, but all of us would like to be



such a wonderful amateur! Dima is a theoretical physicist at Lawrence Berkeley Lab. He was born and raised in Ukraine, studied physics in Moscow (Russia), and did his PhD in Frankfurt (Germany). He learned to play accordion at a free music school in Rivne (Ukraine). He has also played accordion in a Dubna music school orchestra in Russia, in Akkordeonorchester Frankfurter Berg in Germany, and in a Balkan-folk group Batutas, also in Frankfurt. Dima's favorite styles are classical music, European folk music, and



tango; he is currently trying to learn a little bit of jazz. We are delighted to have him join us for the March meeting!





Siyuan started playing accordion at pre-school in Shanghai at age 4. Since moving to California at age 5, he has been a student of Mike Zampiceni for over 4 years. Mike regards Siyuan as one of the two finest students he's ever worked with, and is exceptionally gifted. He's dedicated to the instrument, works diligently, and has a voracious appetite for learning new music. Most adults don't play this well unless they're professionals. In the 10-book Palmer-Hughes course that many of you are familiar with, he's currently working on selections from book 8!

Siyuan has performed at the San Francisco and Silicon Valley accordion clubs several times, and was awarded a scholarship by the San Francisco club in 2019. He has competed in the Cotati student stage in each of the last 4 years, winning a prize each time. In August last year at Cotati, he was the first recipient of the annual Anthony Facciuto award, a \$500 scholarship given to the student who earns the top score in the student stage competition.

#### Jackie Jones, SF street entertainer, delighted crowds with her dancing cat puppet

Jackie Jones, longtime San Francisco musician and member of the San Francisco Accordion Club, died at age 93 on 1/20/2020 in San Francisco.

Born in 1926 in Pensacola, Florida to a Navy family, Jackie yearned to play music from an early age, but her parents refused to pay for an instrument or lessons. Jackie saved her 35 cent a week allowance until she accumulated \$75 to buy an accordion from the Navy Exchange store. She spent hours in her room, teaching herself to play.

In 1946, Jackie moved to New Orleans to pursue her dream of making music. Living in the city's colorful French Quarter, she would



beg bands to let her sit in, just to get experience. Jackie's first paid gig was \$3 a night, playing her accordion for eight hours straight with a country band. She learned other instruments – guitar, then drums and vibraphone – and by the late 1940s, she was supporting herself as a working musician.

In 1952, Jackie drove her 1948 woody station wagon west, settling in San Francisco. To pay the rent, she held a variety of day jobs (taxi driver, assembly-line worker, US postal mail sorter), but she never stopped making music, working with anyone who'd hire her. She played accordion at the 1954 opening of San Francisco Airport's International Terminal, the city's Russian festivals and Columbus Day celebrations, and at the Fairmont Hotel with a Latin trio.

When her work in bars and nightspots dried up in the 1980s, Jackie reinvented herself. She learned the musical saw, created a lavender tap dancing cat out of wood and bike parts, and became a one woman band. For 25 years, Jackie entertained at S.F. street fairs, farmers markets, festivals, and children's events. She continued performing gigs into her 90s, bringing music and joy to thousands.

Jackie always kept a warm place in her heart for the accordion, playing it with her last band, the Vintage Swing Ensemble. She joined the SF Accordion Club in the 1990s, and was a featured performer at monthly meetings at least twice. A celebration of Jackie's life, held in San Francisco on February 1, included music by two local accordionists, Jean Butler and Caroline Grannan.

#### Accordions at the Musical Instrument Museum in Phoenix - by Mike Zampiceni

Being an avid auto buff, in mid-January I attended the vintage car auctions held annually in Scottsdale. While scouting for an Airbnb close to the venues, I noted a landmark on Google Maps for the Musical Instrument Museum. I initially thought this would be an inconsequential, relatively small display of popular vintage instruments. I was totally incorrect in my assumption. The museum is an expansive, two-story, modern facility arranged by continents, with sections for every country within the continents, instrument types, and noted performers. The display for each country featured instruments prominent in that country's history.

A placard in the lobby near the entrance proudly states that this collection is regarded as one of the best 15 museums in the country. More than 10,000 instruments are contained within, and most displays have a video screen with four different programs running continuously. You're given headphones and a module upon entry, and it acts as a self-guided tour. When you're near the screen, you're able to hear the audio portion. When I determined that there was no way I could cover everything in the museum when I arrived mid-afternoon on a Friday, I upgraded my ticket to return for just another \$10, which I did the following day.

Not surprisingly, the first question I asked after purchasing my ticket was "Where are the accordions?" The cashier pointed me in the direction of the Europe continent floor upstairs. Sure enough, a few feet inside this floor revealed a display of accordion curios, ranging from obscure, primitive instruments from the early 19<sup>th</sup> century to contemporary accordions. Besides the instruments in the accordion display, many others were located throughout the building within the individual country displays in which the accordion was part of the culture. I saw a couple of oddities, such as the accordion with an attached horn, and one with foot-operated bellows.

I discovered a room marked "Mechanical Instruments," which displayed a plethora of passively played instruments, mostly from the early 20th century. I always thought that instruments powered by rolls were limited to pianos, but as the picture shows, several unlikely instruments could be operated from rolls, of which the vintage concertina was one. The room also contains an Orchestrion, also operated by paper rolls as shown in the accompanying picture. It was built in 1926 for dance halls, and is essentially a small theater-style pipe organ. As you can see, two accordions are prominently positioned above all of the lesser musical machinery. I was fortunate to see a live demonstration of the instrument, and the accordions function guite well.

I had no idea such a museum existed in Phoenix, but I'm glad I followed up on my inclination to visit. If you're ever in the area, I

On the afternoon of February 9, Lou's tour started with the **Accordion Lovers Society International** (San Diego Accordion Club) luncheon meeting at the occasional meeting location, **Mangia Italiano** restaurant in Chula Vista. 
