February's Accordion Circle in Piedmont, our first meeting <u>not</u> in Millbrae since we moved our programs there from Oyster Point several years ago, was attended by an enthusiastic group of accordionists and friends, some 27 in all, most of whom were new to our Club! One new member joined on the spot; we believe others will follow as well. Several expressed interest in formal lessons.

The Piedmont High School Student Center was charming, with wood-beamed ceilings, great acoustics, and lots of room to spread out. We're informed that the Student Center building was constructed as part of the President Roosevelt era Work Progress Administration (WPA) program, while the country was in the throes of the Great Depression. The building has been preserved for its historic and architectural value, while most of the remainder of the campus is new construction. Needless to say, everyone loved the setting!

The meeting was capably emceed by Rosemary Busher, with Ken Schwartz also chiming in. There were a few minor glitches, to be expected with a new venue, including searching for electrical outlets (it's an older building) and some technical issues with Zoom, due to loss of battery power on a laptop computer (my oversight), but that said, everyone had a wonderful time and guess what – our East Bay members want us to return soon!

Fourteen talented accordionists participated in the jam session, skillfully led by Joseph Martin. Practice counts – the group performed a great rendition of the *Boogie Woogie Swing* for its finale. Following a terrific jam session, several in the group offered to play a few solo songs.

Scott Anderson led off with a lovely rendition of *Fascination*, which he started out as a waltz before transposing the key up a 4th and changing the rhythm to a rumba. Well done, Scott! Next, Scott played Beethoven's *Für Elise*, also well done.

Next up was Thomas Seiter, who played several songs. A native of Germany, Thomas leads the group **Polkageist West**, which performs around the Bay. Thomas thrilled us with a rousing singing rendition of *Bluegrass Polka*; followed by a bit of the story of his life and then something really special – *Jambalaya*, which he sang to entertain all in the Circle. Thomas then played a terrific duet of *Beer Barrel Polka* with Mike Zampiceni, who both played and sang. The duo had everyone stompin' on the floor. We wish you all could have been there to enjoy it! Mike then soloed with *Norwegian Wood* and his own wonderful and most unexpected version of *I Can't Get No Satisfaction*!!

Next, Ken Schwartz borrowed Rosemary Busher's small Giuletti and played A Gay Ranchero followed by Sabre Dance. Finally, Edward Spondike, via Zoom from Ohio, played a wonderfully melodic composition of his called Listen to the Rain, followed by Neil Baker's A Waltz For Lily.

Many thanks to Rosemary Busher, who was the spark for and lead organizer for this first ever East Bay meeting; to Randy Hicks, who located the venue; to Joseph Martin for leading the jam session; and to our teachers in attendance, Joel Weber and Mike Zampiceni, for providing encouragement and inspiration to their students.

We wish all of you could have been at the meeting. It was a wonderful, warm introduction to our East Bay colleagues, who are waiting for us to return. Stay tuned!

Chiropractic and Accordions, a Strange Brew

Sometimes there is no good explanation for events and circumstances to have become almost impossibly intertwined. Such is the case for Elaine and me, who keep finding our accordion lives jumbled up with our chiropractic careers.

The first instance came about when we began attending meetings of the SFAC at Oyster Point, our former venue. Lynn Ewing was the President at that time. Somehow in conversation with Elaine, Lynn mentioned that Bill, her former husband, just happened to be the current President of Palmer West, a chiropractic college in San Jose. Well, not only had Bill been Elaine's boss at the chiropractic college in Iowa before she moved to California, but I was employed by Palmer West at the time and had known Bill since 1985! Three decades prior, when I worked for another college, Bill and I each represented our respective Bay Area chiropractic colleges at research conferences.

The second instance came about when I, in casual conversation with SFAC member Dr. Scott Anderson, learned that Dr. Scott was a PhD in anthropology and an MD, to boot. My jaw hung when I heard that, because in the early '90s I



CHIROPRAXIS Robert Cooperstein MA, DC had inherited a quarterly column writing for **Dynamic Chiropractic**, a trade journal, from a person who may have been the chiropractic profession's first triple degree doctor: PhD (anthropology, of course), MD, and DC. In fact, I had shared classes with this person, Dr. Robert Anderson (a real kidder in those days), when he was earning his chiropractic degree in the early 1980s! Scott broke out in a huge grin – "Well, that's Bob, my father!" Who would a thunk it, I had inherited *his father's* column in this trade journal! By the way, with a circulation of around 50,000, it featured my face 4 times a year and sort of made me well known in the profession. I still have articles and columns written by Dr. Anderson.

The third chiropractic-accordion entirely unexpected confluence occurred just 2 weeks ago in Las Vegas, where I had been invited to speak at a truly huge chiropractic seminar. Running into Sherry, a former student of mine from the early '90s (who at this time is a prominent spokesperson for the chiropractic profession), somehow



it came up in conversation that she is the grandniece of none other than Lawrence Welk, that she is mentioned in a book about him, and that her mother had been given three of Welk's earliest accordions! Yes, she also knew Myron Floren and his sister Val Brewer, who played for the SFAC in October, 2010.

Guess it's a small world.


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
Lou Soper (center) — SFAC Founders




