




The credit for jump-starting my journey with the accordion goes to Weird Al Yankovic, strangely enough. The accordion always had a presence in my life, though it was in the background for most of it. My family is from the Czech Republic, and my aunt played for a very long time. I remember experimenting with her accordion when I was about five or six; no real music, I was just fascinated with the multitude of buttons. Jumping forward sixteen years (with about eight years of choir and four years of piano thrown into the mix), in college I happened to see a YouTube video of Weird Al playing a short song on an accordion app for the iPad. This sparked a cascade of events: I downloaded the same app myself and became hooked. We happened to visit family in the Czech Republic that summer so I had the opportunity to try out my aunt's accordion again, that led to almost my entire vacation being spent in the barn practicing, and that resulted in my folks purchasing one as a Christmas present from Smythe's Accordion Center in Oakland.

I practiced and played regularly for about four years, incorporating

it into my artistic career as much as I could (I studied acting at CalArts down in Southern California; the picture


is from a production of Shakespeare's The Merchant of Venice). I played all kinds of genres, with a preference for Czech polkas and Viennese waltzes. As so often happens, life eventually got in the way, and I stopped playing. But a few months ago, an old high school friend of mine mentioned that he had started playing and suggested that I check out the SFAC. I'm very glad I did and look forward to rekindling my love for this unique instrument.

# New Member Profile: Ed Spondike – Painesville, OH

**Ed Spondike** took accordion lessons from age 10 to 14. He enjoyed classical music and playing music composed and arranged by accordionists such as Charles Magnante. He wanted to attend college to become a high school music teacher, so he stopped taking accordion lessons and took up the bassoon. He continued playing the accordion for his own enjoyment and on gigs with other musicians. At college his teaching plans changed. He became a physics and mathematics instructor who played the bassoon in the college's concert band, symphony orchestra, pit band, and wind quartet. He kept his accordion skills honed by playing for his parents.

Moonlighting to supplement his teaching salary and support his family, Ed played his accordion in several groups and also taught at a local music store. After 8 years of high school teaching, Ed took up a new career developing pressure-sensitive adhesives. Music remained a hobby, playing with small groups for weddings, parties and the like. He dabbled with composing polkas, waltzes, and other types of dance music.

Now retired, Ed has more time to devote to composing and arranging music. He credits Joe Natoli for renewing his interest in composing and arranging music for the accordion. Ed has performed both his original compositions and arrangements of other composers' music at accordion club Zoom meetings across the US.

# Ed Spondike Composes Accordion Music

Ed is a prolific composer and has written a number of accordion pieces for his former band group as well as for his own personal enjoyment. His interest in Irish and Eastern European music comes from his cultural background. At many of

the online meetings, he has presented waltzes, ballads, and polkas, but he is not limited to these styles or genres. He enjoys taking music that may have only 16 – 20 bars and enhancing them by adding variations on their theme, or simply adding a new key signature or style within the music. As a dance band leader, he needed music that could keep the dancers on the floor but not tire them. Over the years he has amassed quite a collection of his own music creations. He has been sharing these with interested accordionists across the USA. Critiques of his music have been very positive, as Ed writes music that you can easily adapt to your own style of play.



In addition to writing new music, Ed has arranged other music when music for accordion cannot be found. He enjoys the challenge of working on themes for his music and especially loves sharing with others in his retirement years. If you want something different, Ed can find that style or genre for you. 


