2020 Cotati Virtual Accordion Festival: Event Review

This just wasn't meant to be the summer for live music at sunny La Plaza Park, perched on a haystack, enjoying the camaraderie of our club's tent at the annual **Cotati Accordion Festival**. Sadly, pandemics don't appreciate fine accordion music. Thus, addressing obstacles facing performing arts organizations and performers this year, the festival, out of necessity reinvented itself with its first **Cotati Virtual Accordion Festival**. Performances by 14 talented accordionists from across Europe and North America were featured. There were only a few glitches, all related to broadband issues, but none detracted from the fine performances and great music from a talented group of musicians. The festival presented the first-ever virtual Lady-of-Spain Play along, with pre-recorded mini-performances, all perfectly synchronized.

SFAC Zooming into the Virtual World

When the SFAC made the transition to Zoom in place of live musical programs for the time-being, our first thought was to recreate a virtual venue to continue our tradition of alternating programs featuring professional accordionists and others where our own members, with various degrees of accomplishment, could play for each other. That has worked out exceedingly well, with relatively high attendance and virtually no problems implementing the Zoom format. Suddenly everyone, including people who were not initially comfortable with the streaming world, has become proficient in logging in and getting all their settings correct.

After several months had passed with no obvious timeline for resuming in-person programs, a question emerged for the SFAC: should we allow and even encourage our professional accordionists to solicit "virtual tips" during their online performances, as so many professional musicians around the country are now do-



ing? The SFAC Board of Directors, after considerable discussion, has decided *yes*, our professional performers should be allowed to request virtual tips. The Club pays a relatively modest stipend to our Zoom performers, but this in no way offsets their considerable loss of income due to the cessation of live performances and many of their teaching engagements. It would be nice to see SFAC members step up to offer additional support.

So, don't be surprised if our performers, if they choose to do so, provide a PayPal address in the chat window during their performance, or even place a placard of some type on the screen with instructions how to donate while they are playing. The SFAC would rather not receive tips earmarked for performers, we strongly prefer such tips go straight to them.

In other news: SFAC member Colette Ogata has agreed to become the new president of the Silicon Valley Accordion Society (SVAS)! Congratulations to Colette! As a goodwill gesture, the SFAC has invited the membership of SVAS to visit our September 20th Accordions Live event featuring **Alicia Jo Straka**.

SFAC Lifetime Achievement Award (2014) honoree, Lou Jacklich (pictured left) was fêted August 2020 by his students and friends across

the US via Zoom in honor of his 92nd birthday and 75 years as an outstanding accordion teacher, performer and electronic accordion pioneer. The celebratory program included almost 30 self-introductions and fond reminiscing by each guest who all had interesting experiences to share about the maestro. Attendees gained a closer perspective of our beloved teacher and friend.



Touching remembrances coupled with heartfelt toasts to Lou Jacklich's continued success, longevity and health were raised by Steve Marshall, Scott Anderson MD, Monica Ambalal, Colette Ogata and Rich Faria. Lou Le Brun (Springfield, MO), virtuoso accordionist, performed an excellent jazz rendition of "Misty." Students who also entertained on Zoom includ-

ed: Scott Anderson MD, Jeremy Jeans, Kaisu Lankinen, Pamela Tom, and Jane Tripi.

PowerPoint slide presentations were synchronized with solo accordion music recordings by students (Kaisu Lankinen, David Lanyon, Pamela Tom, and Jane Tripi) and excerpts from Lou's 1962 Capitol 33 RPM Custom Label record, "Lou Jacklich Plays" to highlight his career over time: 1) early years, 2) teaching, 3) band leader [with combos, student, and community bands], 4) virtuoso soloist, 5) current and past students, and 6) past birthday photos.

Ed Massolo first hosted him and he stayed at my home three times, I believe. At first, he played almost exclusively Russian music, having recently emigrated from Moldova with his cellist-wife, Rosa. Last year after Cotati he came here to the Forum and gave us a concert; I even managed to play a duet with him! He plays a Petosa bayan in a word, effortlessly.

According to Marian, The Mesa Accordion Event began as an accordion "camp" in Mesa, AZ, hosted by Frank Marocco and organized by Joan and Dan Graumann. It


consisted of 60 or so accordionists until Frank passed away. To this day Joan and Dan are big Stas supporters.

GUESS WHO (from page 5) — It's Ken Schwartz!

Ken Schwartz began playing the accordion at age 8½ after 3 years of joint formal piano lessons with his twin

brother, Richard. The piano bench was wide enough for only one, however, so Ken eagerly jumped (or was gently "pushed") to the instrument with the piano-like keyboard and all those buttons; he liked pushing buttons, even then! The rest is history. Ken started on classical accordion and later learned jazz and popular tunes, skills which served him well when as an undergraduate at UCLA, he was the only accordionist listed in the campus directory (25,000+ students). Ken mixed chemistry by day with music by night and earned his way through college, playing numerous parties and weddings with his brother in the West Los Angeles area. Although his professional career has been in medicine and biotechnology, Ken has never wandered too far from his musical roots, however, and he continues to enjoy learning and performing on the accordion to this day.



A side note: Ken's accordion teacher, Harvey Tarter, instructed him in Long Beach, NY. Mr. Tarter was still in his teens (18 years old!) when he began to teach Ken and others and sponsored his annual student recitals, and he's still teaching to this day, 60 years later, now in Oceanside, NY!




