
The Smiling Faces of SFAC- during our August ZOOM Event (Review on page 5)



August Accordion Circle Event Summary

The SFAC August Accordion Circle featured member performers who once again wowed us with their incredible talents! Ken Schwartz emceed, along with co-hosts Rosemary Busher and Colette Ogata.



Next, **Lou Le Brun** performed her bouncy rendition of a song new to many of us: *An Operatic Rag* (by Pietro Frosini), complete with bellows shake! Lou enjoys performing for crowds, always with a smile, as she's done since her teens. Well done, Lou, so please return for more, and soon.



Joe Domitrowich performed fabulously on his Concerto model DA accordion which demonstrated so many of the musical sounds achieved with midi. He performed and sang to *Train Ride*, which is a medley of train songs, including *Dueling Banjos* (Arthur Smith 1954) made popular by the 1972 movie **Deliverance** fol-

lowed by a few bars of "I come from Alabama with a banjo on my knee" and segued into a few bars of Fol-

som Prison Blues by Johnny Cash and Orange Blossom Special with banjo, accordion and fiddle samples. We could hear the train sounds and Joe's singing! The last song, the well-known Freight Train, was composed by Elizabeth Cotten, a nanny in N. Carolina. Perhaps a hobo who has jumped the train; he awakens and isn't sure he's on the right train. A train whistle and locomotive sounds can be heard in the song, thanks to Joe's creative use of midi embellishments and bellows techniques. As the song gained fame, others claimed ownership of the song. A happy ending, however: the prominent folk-singing Seeger family helped to restore her rights to her composition.



Oye Cómo Va (Tito Puente 1963, later popularized by Santana), featured lots of syncopation. Joe also sang, and with special digital effects, including singing in unison with a virtual singer (himself in duet). Truly amazing!

Joe also performed an encore later in today's program: the classic *Blue Danube Waltz*, with his own interpretation, including numerous instruments (midi, of course). It was nice, relaxing and perfect for a Sunday afternoon concert.



Lorna Anderson gave a terrific performance of *Glow Worm* followed by her rendition of the famous *Czardas* (V Monti). Both were perfect! Thank you, as always, Lorna!

Reno Di Bono played *Do Nothing Until You Hear from Me* (Duke Ellington); it has a chromatic step up, which is typical Ellington style, embellished with Reno's unique

style of jazz chords. Next was Mozart, which he ZOOMs with his students on Sunday mornings – *Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star*. Reno demonstrated for us (and his students, who were online), how this simple tune can serve as a platform for jazz

improvisation/progression/chords. It was a beautiful jazz interpretation, but coming from Reno, we're not surprised. He makes jazz look so easy! We hope Reno's students will play for us!

Fond Farewell, Norma Zonay-Parsons

Norma Zonay-Parsons, early member of the SFAC, co-founder of the Silicon Valley Accordion Society, member of AbsolutAccord, and a passionate accordionist/performer/teacher, passed away on August 23, 2021, age 94.



Norma was originally from Southern California. She had entertained since her teens, was lead singer and accordionist touring with her own trio for a number of years, playing in clubs,



shows and radio. Norma teamed for several years in a violin/accordion duo with a noted violin impresario in Salt Lake City, doing POPS Concerts and a weekly variety TV show. Norma for many years taught in her studio in San Jose and performed with Bellows and the Bow, a violin/accordion duo, and later with AbsolutAccord.

The Silicon Valley Accordion Society was founded in 2003. Norma served as the first vice president and program director. She made it possible for SVAS to make Harry's Hofbrau its permanent home.

Those of us who knew Norma at SVAS and AbsolutAccord meetings were immediately struck by her warm smile and friendship. She will be deeply missed.

An update about accordionist Val Floren Brewer -- August 2021 by Dave Chelini




Accordion Friends:

I thought I would write a short article for SFAC about **Valborg Floren Brewer**. I recently had the chance to see Val at Eskaton Care Center.
What a treat for me to refresh some memories of this wonderful lady. Val taught and performed on the accordion in the Sacramento area since the 1960's and would visit SFAC occasionally to perform. She has reminisced that she especially enjoyed playing with the two other "Vals" — Val Kieser and another Val. She loved that interaction as **The Three Vals**. Her last performance at SFAC was in 2015 for the club's 100-year anniversary

accompanied by her son Jan (drums) and daughter-in-law Carole (vocalist).

In 2016 Val suffered a stroke that disabled her left arm, thus limiting any accordion playing. She has remained upbeat and still enjoys music especially played on the accordion. On our last visit with Val, Jan played the spoons and I used a lightweight accordion. She participated by directing us with her right hand while singing *Edelweiss*. In November, Val will be 98, but her health has declined somewhat so I wanted to share these thoughts with you. In the picture, Val's smile says it all.

SFAC Members at 2021 AAA Virtual Festival

Due to Covid restrictions, the American Accordion Association (AAA) held its annual accordion festival's competition virtually in July. SFAC members and adult students of Lou Jacklich, Kaisu Lankinen and I, participated in several AAA adult solo categories with a combined total of seven solos.

Congratulations to Kaisu who was awarded medals in three solo categories: *Czardas* (solo), *In the Mood* (jazz) and *Koiviston polska - Ellin polka* [Finland] (ethnic) https://youtu.be/ExeN3gpntll.

I earned medals in two solo categories *Dance of the Comedians* (solo), and my arrangement of *Ashokan Farewell* and *Battle Hymn of the Republic* (pop). In AAA's Honor Category I compet-

ed with Deiro compositions: *Tranquillo* [required] and *Pietro's Return*. I had three months to learn *Tranquillo*. I recommend planning ahead... like a year perhaps?

Whether student or not, I highly encourage you to consider competing in the adult competitions. In most cases, you are free to compete with any tune of your choice. In addition to AAA, there are other competitions (live and virtual) offered via Accordionists and Teachers Guild, International (ATG), Leavenworth International Accordion Celebration, and Accordion Teachers Association of Massachusetts Inc. Accordion Star International 2021 was a new virtual competition in April which included two SFAC members and students of Mike Zampiceni: Anand Joseph (adult) and Siyuan Liu Donnelly (youth).

The live competitions require travel while the virtual competitions give you the opportunity to record yourself and upload your entry to YouTube. Entering a competition gives you a unique experience of learning a piece well and gaining confidence playing it before a camera or live audience. The feedback from the judges often provides insight on how to improve technique and interpretation. It is beneficial to really like the tune you are working on as you may spend hours (upon hours) rehearsing. Some competitions require memorization. I enter the competitions where memorization is optional. Entry fees and membership fees may apply. For me, competing makes me focus. I feel that my reading skills, expression, performing and networking with other competitors have enhanced my journey with the accordion. With thanks to my teacher, Mr. Lou Jacklich, for his patience and guidance in helping me prepare for the competition!



ZOOM Composition Workshop and Concert - Rescheduled

The Not Just Oompah Music Composition Workshop and Concert featuring Joseph Natoli have been moved. The ZOOM Concert is on Sunday September 26 at 3-4 PM Central Time (\$25). The ZOOM Music Composition Workshops are on Monday September 27 and Tuesday September 28 from 7-9:30 PM Central Time (\$70 which includes the concert). The NJO workshop will focus on composing music and include these topics: Critical Elements in Composition and Arranging, Alternative Stradella Chord Voicings, Using Accordion Registers Effectively (How to Orchestrate Possibilities Beyond That Master Switch), and How to Play Musically.
