SFAC Members Had a Great Time at the ATG Festival in Kansas City

This year's Accordionists and Teachers Guild (ATG) Festival was held July 25-27, 2024 in Kansas City. The festival program consisted of numerous concerts, competitions and workshops of the highest caliber.

The ATG Festival was extended this year for an additional day in honor of Joan Cochran Sommers, a living legend in the international accordion community, for her invaluable lifetime contributions to the furtherment of performance and educational standards. In so doing, she has elevated the status of the accordion as a serious professional musical instrument, particularly in the United States. Remarkably, she was able to convince the University of Kansas City, in 1961 at the age of 27, to accept the accordion as a major instrument for college credits. Eventually, students could earn a Bachelors, Masters, and Doctorate of Music degrees using the accordion as their chosen instrument. Joan headed the department for 40 years, and to this day, her program has been the only one of its kind in this country. After her retirement over 20 years ago, Joan continued to arrange and conduct orchestral pieces for the accordion and has traveled worldwide as an adjudicator for prestigious accordion competitions.

SFAC was well represented at ATG. Members in attendance included **Paul Cain, Gail Campanella, Christine Esteban, the Anand Joseph Family (Anand, Annabelle and Jennifer - sisters), Joe Petosa and Mike Zampiceni**. Paul Cain participated as ATG's annual sound expert and was busy throughout the event in production support by setting up electronics, amplification, microphones, and speakers.

In addition to the ATG Orchestra, Gail also played one piece in the "Original Music concert".

Gail noted that "This year's convention was spectacular.....honoring Joan Cochran Sommers' 90th birthday. The four young competitors for the ATG World Cup competition were from Chile, Sweden, USA, and Moldova. Radu Ratoi from Moldova received the \$5,000 first-place award. All were inspiring virtuosos in their 20s. Mike Zampiceni was there with his darling students, and he entertained at the Saturday luncheon. Christine remarked that "Mike's soloing was wonderful."

Congratulations to Mike Zampiceni's students (Anand, Annabelle, and Jennifer), who were well-prepared for their competitions and received superior or excellent ratings for their performances! Anand entered two categories: 1) Free-bass solo with *Primavera* by Ludovico Einaudi, arranged for free-bass accordion by Anand, and 2) Digital accordion solo with

Spy Movie Medley - James Bond 007 and Pink Panther, also arranged by Anand. He earned Superior Rating medals (scores 95-100).

Annabelle (in the green dress) received an Excellent Rating medal for entering the under 9 open solo category with *French Card* by V. Bakanov, while Jennifer (in the lavender dress) was awarded two Excellent Rating medals in the categories of under 9 “open solo” with *Vegetables on Parade* by Palmer-Hughes and original solo with *Sweet Treats* by Joseph Natoli. The sisters also entered the under 9 duet category with *Little Brown Jug Polka*, arranged by Palmer-Hughes, and received an Excellent Rating for their performance.

The sisters were two of five competitors invited to perform during the awards presentation ceremony at the University of Missouri – Kansas City Conservatory. Before the results for the ATG World Cup were announced, they performed their [duet on stage](https://youtu.be/Hh-KrIF3C4Q) (youtu.be/Hh-KrIF3C4Q). Furthermore, Annabelle and Jennifer took the ATG Syllabus exams for level 1 and prep level, respectively. The girls passed the exam and received certificates for their accomplishments. They are well on their way to becoming accomplished accordionists like their dad, Anand.

Mike Zampiceni, reflecting on his experience at ATG, writes “I’m proud of Anand and his daughters for participating in this very special ATG festival, and for their hard work and dedication in achieving their awards ... Several months ago, I decided to commit to attending what I expected to be a momentous accordion event, given that Joan Sommers would be honored, and the caliber of performances would probably be even higher than the usual ATG standards. Joan is a super ager, and I would challenge most people 20 years her junior to match her zeal, cognitive ability, and vigorous energy. And of course, her musicianship and music knowledge is peerless. I was fortunate to be one of her orchestra members a couple of times in past years, and she’s still just as engaged and energetic as she was then.

The final concert of the festival Saturday evening featured the ATG festival orchestra, consisting of over 70 accordionists! As if that weren’t enough, the first and last pieces of the orchestra program also included a 40-member choir. Prior to the orchestra concert, international superstar Dr. Michael Bridge from Toronto performed a scintillating, memorable program. One of the highlights of my experiences was the ATG World Cup competition. The winner, Radu Ratoi, opened with *Dance Macabre* by Saint-Saens and reprised the piece for the evening audience. His performance will always be etched in my musical conscience and was nothing short of electrifying and stunning.

There were many more stellar artists that deserve recognition and accolades for their work over the course of several days, but time and space are finite. ATG’s mission is to promote excellence in performance and education, so I would highly recommend that students and professionals join this invaluable guild. Student memberships are just \$25 per year.”

In Memory - Louise Faye Le Brun

Our dear club member Louise Faye LeBrun, 93, of Wilmington NC, formerly of Springfield MO, peacefully passed away Tuesday July 16, 2024. She was born in Los Angeles, California, on September 26, 1930. Lou worked as a computer programmer for many years, particularly in an era where women did not work in that profession. But her love in life was playing her accordion. At 7 years old, her uncle purchased her first accordion and lessons.

At age 12 she joined an LA-based USO troop that traveled on weekends to military bases and hospitals in California and adjoining states. She eventually worked for the Ferraro Accordion studios. In the late 40s, the era of the Women's Clubs, she began playing in beautiful homes where meetings convened. It was during this time that Lou learned to tap dance as well.

After her retirement in 2021 she continued to entertain many audiences in multiple venues with her singing, dancing, and accordion-playing. She was truly a shining star to all who knew her. A highlight of her career was appearing as a guest in 2018 on "The Mystery Hour" in Springfield Missouri. In 2020 she was honored as an inductee into the American Accordion Hall of Fame of the **Federation of American Musicians, Singers and Performing Artists (FAMSPA)**. She was featured as a cover page guest artist on the April 2021 special edition of *Accordion Stars Illustrated* magazine.

She is survived by her daughter Penny of Wilmington (Jerome), son Jeffrey of Ocala, Florida (Patti) and son Jeffrey of Columbus, Ohio. She is also survived by her many accordion friends from all over the country.

A private family ceremony was held. 2024 Paris Olympics Opening Ceremony Includes Popular Accordionist

Our beloved accordion had a featured role at the 2024 Paris Olympics! During the opening ceremony, the talented French contemporary accordion star, Félicien Brut, was the angelic accordionist cautiously perched above the white Olympic rings on the Pont d'Austerlitz (bridge that crosses the Seine River). Facebook users can [hear](https://www.facebook.com/reel/2622502727928163) Félicien's solo performance of *La Foule* while observing him prepare for the famous bridge scene and the impressive display of French flag-colored (red, white and blue) plumes of smoke posted on his Instagram reel: <https://www.facebook.com/reel/2622502727928163>.

A rousing orchestral rendition of *La Foule* (The Crowd), made famous by Edit Piaf in 1957, punctuated by the blaring accordion announced the welcoming of the flotilla of nations and their athletes cruising on the Seine River. One minute into a Radio France French interview with Félicien Brut you can hear 30 seconds of the accordion dramatically piercing the "La Foule" fanfare (www.radiofrance.fr/franceculture/podcasts/les-midis-de-culture/felicien-brut-la-revanche-de-l-accordeon-7928860). Throughout non-athletic programming and commercials during the Olympics, tv viewers can listen to the lovely subtle melodic sounds of a musette-tuned accordion in the background.

Please join me in welcoming our newest member, **Helayna Harris Taylor**. I always invite our new members to submit a short bio for our newsletter, but only occasionally receive one. Helayna is one of the exceptions. I hope you find this bio



as intriguing as I do. As for the photo, Helayna writes "I thought it'd be also fun to send you this photo of me with accordion when I was a kid."

I was born in Brooklyn in 1952 and raised in Queens New York. My mother was striving to be a professional tap dancer until she got caught up in the Polio epidemic and got Polio at around age 8. She then followed up with piano and singing, so became a professional singer instead. She sang at nightclubs and the Catskills resorts. Thus, my sister and I were raised in a very musical environment and took various music and voice lessons. My mom gave up the professional route and was a voice and piano teacher after my sister became a few years old. So, music was a major value in our home. My sister and I used to do singing duets and routines for company, and I so enjoyed it.

I started playing accordion from a young age and was in an accordion orchestra that won state trophies. I recall I entered a contest singing the song *More* and playing accordion and won a trophy too. I was always very small, and it was funny how you could hardly see me behind my 120 bass accordion. I stopped playing when I was in college, as it was the 70s, and I guess I thought I was too "cool" and it was nerdy then. After undergrad I got my Master's degree

in Rehab psychology and then went on to get my PhD In Psych from University of Pittsburgh. My life moved into professional life and I raised a family. My husband and I moved to California in 1989, and I did various psychology jobs and spent 15 years with the department of Corrections as a psychologist for sex offender parolees. I retired from there in 2015, and now do a small private practice of 2 days a week in online sessions.

Finally, I decided to get back to accordion. I saw a group perform Klezmer and Zydeco at a concert and got motivated. I bought an accordion a few months ago and am at it again. The hardest part is working my bass hand well, but it is coming back to me and I love it! I live in Lagunitas, in West Marin, and I sit in my yard among the redwoods and enjoy playing there to the trees!

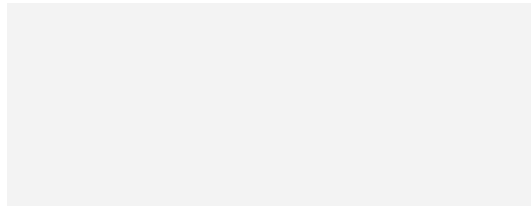
