Tracey Collins has earned extensive praise throughout New Zealand and Australia from her industry peers and audiences as an artist and entertainer.

Her amazing talent and beautiful, humorous, and engaging personality make her known as a highly sought-after professional musician who works passionately on showing audiences how vibrant and versatile the accordion is; proving that it is a very modern and relevant instrument for both the older and younger generations.



Tracey is a full-time artist performing at festivals and touring around the globe in such countries as Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Australia, Koala Lampur, and the United States. She has been a solo guest artist in her home country of New Zealand with the Auckland Symphony Orchestra and the Auckland Choir. When she isn't touring, Tracey is also a session musician for numerous artists and recordings and television. Tracey also has three albums to her credit: **Bonjour, Paris** (French), **Live at Pastis**, and **Fury**. She is currently working on a fourth - **A Musical Journey with Tracey Collins**.

In 2010 Tracey was approached by Roland Corporation, Australasia, to join their team as product specialist for the digital Accordion where she travelled extensively for several years throughout Australasia demonstrating at trade shows, conferences and workshops. Among Tracey's two principal accordions, one is fully digital, which allows her to experiment with sounds and styles of music not normally associated with the instrument, thereby bringing a wow-factor to her shows, where the audience is left truly amazed.

Guest Artist



Having been an SFAC Board member for almost a decade, I can testify to having been part of countless discussions about how to get more *young people* involved in accordion music, to ensure perpetuity of the instrument and its culture even when we ourselves move on - in one way or another. Frankly, it is a good idea for organizations to have a succession strategy to populate the base even as we older folks, well move on.

Strategies for getting younger people involved almost always hinge on some sort of outreach – getting accordions in their hands, offering scholarships for lessons, talking up the instrument to music teachers in public schools, having kids sit down with little accordions at street fairs or at the Cotati Accordion Festival. All of this is good, moving in the right direction.

However, surprisingly, one almost never hears discussion of what these young people would want to *do* with the instrument. Is belting out the *Beer Barrel Polka*, or *The Girl from Ipanema*, or perhaps *Just Because* what they want to do? It is almost as though we think tossing the musical hardware at them will suffice, paying little attention to the musical software they might want to render.

Enter the Stas Venglevski event in Houston we are publicizing in this newsletter. Stas and his orchestra will be playing musical scores associated with the video games almost all youngsters have been playing since childhood. Bravo, what an idea! Many of the scores for these games have been written by legitimate, talented composers, who have adapted the universal cultural experience of youngsters to that stodgy old instrument, that need not be relegated to the tunes that *we senior citizens* grew up with! As Jimi Hendrix may have put it, “Hey Kid, where you goin’ with that accordion in your hand?” Kid answers: “Oh I’m goin’ down to play my favorite tune from Super Mario!”

And that is how to make accordion culture universal and immortal. Insert it into the fabric of today’s world, rather than try to bend the minds of young people to appreciate musical relics. One of these days, sooner rather than later, these young ones will suddenly discover what has gone before, when they are mature enough to appreciate music archeology.


Membership Update

SFAC contributes accordion to Mobile Accordion Classroom Project

In our September newsletter we announced a new project just starting to take shape under the leadership of SFAC member Laura Jean Niland, to introduce the accordion to children and young adults at various workshops in Texas. The organization working toward this goal, Innovative Accordion Music Productions (IAMP), intends to place accordions in schools, churches, and community events. These instruments are for the Mobile Accordion Classroom Project (MACR). Upon learning of this, the SFAC decided to use scholarship funds toward a brand new Hohner Bravo 48 bass accordion.

Laura subsequently contacted us in mid-September to confirm that IAMP had acquired several donated Hohner 48 Bass accordions. In the photograph, the SFAC donation purchased the RED HOHNER BRAVO II at the far right. It bears an inscription identifying the SFAC as having donated this instrument. The organization is about half-way there on this phase of its project and is working on acquiring more 48-bass and 12-bass accordions. The next phase also involves curriculum writing. Needless to say, donations are always welcome!




